DIRECTOR CALL



HESITATION

Come on! It has happened to all of us.

Partner makes a bid (or right hand opponent) and we do not know how to respond. It is fine to take your time to evaluate your options BUT if you take your time and then PASS, that is **illegal** information because it says you have other options.

Similarly, during the play of the hand, it is fine to consider what card to play but it is not fine to take your time if you have a singleton. Hesitation before playing a singleton implies a choice when there is none. It is **illegal**.

If you think that there has been an illegal hesitation, call the Director.

If you have been guilty of an inadvertent hesitation during the auction (your mind was still on the previous hand, for example), you can protect yourself by saying "Sorry, I do not have a problem" and PASSING.

MASTERPOINTS & GAME STRATIFICATIONS.

So, a number of people have questioned how we a) divide the games into Sections and b) how we stratify the games.

The purpose of dividing the games into sections is to allow less experienced players to play againt their peers. Our goal is that, as players gain experience, they will transition into the A section. As an executive we totally understand that it can be very intimidating playing against a pair who have a bazillion match points. So first off, what number of masterpoints constitutes a beginner?

This is what I did.

I took the data base for the last 3 years and extracted the players who have played in that time. I removed people who have passed away.

553 players were in the data set.

Some surprising results:

The median was 310 mps— that is the number where half the data set have fewer than 310 points and half have more.

**A quarter of the dataset had fewer than 50 points. Really surprising but probably represents very occasional players plus people who have tried it and then decided they did not like it.

A quarter of players had more the 900 points. Within this population 40 people had more than 2400 points.

If we wanted to have two equal sections the matchpoint cut-off would be 300. This makes no sense. I don't believe that players with less than 300 points make up half of our regular players—see ** above. If we made the division 900, I believe that the games would be evenly split, if that is what we wanted.

The strats we use are arbitrary, they don't actually relate to the club membership.

It seems unfair to our less experienced players that the Monday game is an Open game.
