Hi members,

On Sept. 22 at our monthly executive meeting, the Alzheimer's Society representatives presented the Bridge Club with the 2020 **Honoured Supporter** award. Our club over the last few years has raised over \$30,000 for Alzheimers Saskatchewan. SBC has raised over \$30,000 in support of the society with their event, even going above and beyond this year to arrange an online event in light of the pandemic.
